The JA programs focused on career and work readiness lay the groundwork about roles in the world of work; and allow youth to gain critical knowledge and skills that enable them to explore, choose, and advance in their future career paths.

Youth develop transferable soft skills and explore careers they might not otherwise have considered. JA's community- and volunteer-based partnerships validate key skills and knowledge needed in the future workforce.

Why is this important?

- JA Programming helps students work toward individual goals and gives them opportunities to develop skills, behaviors, and attitudes required in the workplace, post-secondary education, and in life. Students who learn this way are lifelong learners, as well as adept problem-solvers.
- A JA USA study shows for every one employer who mentions a Hard Skill as a type of skill they
 seek when hiring 18-25-year-olds for entry level positions, almost two (1.8) mentioned a Soft Skill.
 While young adults agree that soft skills are highly sought by employers, they misjudge the need
 for hard skills.
- Additionally, the survey showed, while it is most essential to employers that new hires be honest, have a good work ethic, and are dependable/reliable, fewer young adults feel honesty is the most important trait. Young adults concur with employers on the level of importance of work ethic and dependability.
- By 2030, Michigan Department of Labor and Economic Opportunity (LEO) wants to increase the number of working-age adults with a skill certificate or college degree from 49% to 60% (sixtyby30.org).
